

TO RELEASE EMMA GOLDMAN

Attorney States \$15,000 Bail Furnished Coming Here from Prison.

Harry Weinberger of 261 Broadway, attorney for Emma Goldman and Alexander Berkman, yesterday issued the following statement:

"Emma Goldman, whose term of imprisonment at Jefferson City Prison, Jefferson, Mo., expires on Sept. 27, and whose arrest has been ordered by the Commissioner General of Immigration for deportation, will be released on \$15,000 bail.

"Liberty bonds to the amount of \$15,000 were sent by express last night by her attorney Harry Weinberger to the Commissioner General at Washington, D. C., for bail.

"Miss Goldman will therefore not be arrested and will proceed directly to New York from Jefferson City with her niece, Stella Ballantine.

"In the case of Alexander Berkman, whose term expires on Oct. 3, bail will not be produced until he arrives under arrest in the City of New York, at which time Liberty bonds to the amount of \$15,000 will also be deposited for him. Mr. Weinberger will leave for Atlanta, where Alexander Berkman is confined in the United States Penitentiary, on Saturday night. Berkman is to be brought to Ellis Island by an agent of the Department of Immigration, and Mr. Weinberger will accompany them."
