

MRS. SANGER ACCEPTS BAIL.

Birth Control Advocate Reconsiders Determination to Stay in Jail.

Three birth control advocates were released on bail yesterday pending trial on the charge of disseminating information on birth control, and another, Emma Goldman, Anarchist, was held in \$500 bail on the same charge, for which she served a term in the Queens County Penitentiary last Spring. Mrs. Margaret Sanger and her assistant, Miss Fannie Mindell, were arrested on Thursday night for spreading birth control information at Mrs. Sanger's birth control clinic, 46 Amboy Street, Brownsville.

Mrs. Ethel Byrne, a widow, and sister of Mrs. Sanger, whose arrest followed that of the others, was arraigned yesterday morning in the New Jersey Avenue Court, Brownsville. She said she was glad to be bailed out. Mrs. Sanger, seen then, said that she would stay in jail until she was brought to trial on Monday. Last night her counsel gave bail for her and her assistant before Magistrate Voorhis in Brooklyn.

Emma Goldman, accused of circulating literature on birth control at a meeting in Union Square on May 20, was held in \$1,000 bail in Yorkville Court by Magistrate Barlow. She said she was a lecturer and lived at 20 East 125th Street. As she had been a witness in a similar case in behalf of her attorney, Bolton Hall, she should not have been arrested, she asserted. Hall was discharged several days ago.

Arrest Manager of Strikebreakers.

Edwin F. Daley, former manager of Bergoff & Waddell of 120 Liberty Street, who furnished many of the strikebreakers in the traction fight in this city, was arrested yesterday at his home in Wilkes-Barre, Penn., by Detective Bernard Flood on an indictment charging grand larceny. According to Assistant District Attorney Bohan, the defendant fled from this city on Sept. 26 with \$500 of his employers' money. He was indicted on Oct. 10.

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
